Instruction for Author

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The various sections of the manuscript should be assembled in the following sequence:

1. Title and Authorship: Give first name, last name and the complete mailing address of all institutions where work was conducted and identify the affiliation of each author. If the current address of an author is different, include it in a footnote on the title page. Provide the telephone number and e-mail address of corresponding author also.

2. Abstract: The abstract should be a clear, concise (250 words), one-paragraph summary, informative rather than descriptive, giving scope and purpose, experimental approach, significant results, and major conclusions.

3. Keywords: Provide significant 3-5 keywords

4. Introduction: State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results. This section may include a theory and a Calculation representing a practical development from a theoretical basis.

5. Material and methods: Provide sufficient detail to allow the work to be reproduced. Methods already published should be indicated by a reference: only relevant modifications should be described.

6. Results and Discussion: should be clear and concise. This should explore the significance of the results of the work. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature.

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8. Acknowledgment: Include essential credits but hold to an absolute minimum. Omit academic and social titles Acknowledgment of financial support of the work can be included here.
